Joel has been the Director of Consulting and Creative Services (CCS) at Unique Venues (UV) since January 2020, and has been engaged as a consultant for UV more than 35 times since 2015. In his role as the Director of CCS, Joel works directly with UV clients on consultations involving the marketing, sales, operational, and financial needs of meetings and events venues, assists with website evaluations and design, and oversees projects in the UV design studio including digital brochures and venue videos. He also assists with the with the program for the UV Annual Marketing Conference, and recently redesigned the UV Sales Plan Bootcamp to be delivered in a hybrid format.
